



KENNETH B MYER AWARD FOR PROJECT DEVELOPMENT

The Kenneth B Myer Award for Project Development aims to select and support emerging talent in the screen production landscape, with a focus on creative development.

It provides up to \$20,000 to support an exceptional graduate or small team of graduates (up to 3) in the first year following their graduation in the development of a single project with the guidance of a mentor.

Applicants must submit an outline of the proposed project with a detailed account of the way in which the Award would enable the further development.

Applicants for this award must demonstrate exceptional creative potential, a strong interest in a creative career in screen arts and broadcast sector, and potential for innovation and leadership at the highest level.

The 2011 Award will be presented at Graduation on Friday 9 December 2011. All students graduating in 2011 are eligible.

The recipient will be required to deliver a report to the Director, Corporate and Student Services within 12 months of Graduation. The report should include a reconciliation of expenditure and statement or record of progress for the project. All or part of the report may be used by AFTRS (and its licensees) for educational, archival, acquittal, reporting and other governance purposes, and to promote AFTRS, the Kenneth B Myer Award, or both.

Copyright in the project, or outcomes that arise from the development supported by this award, remain with the original holders.

In the event that, for any reason, the recipient is not able to fulfil all the requirements of the award, they should immediately inform the Director, Corporate and Student Services. If it is not possible to find an appropriate alternative, the recipient may be required to return some or all of the funds.

Selection Criteria

Selection will be based on a written application, a portfolio, and a CV. Final selection will be made by interview.

Applicants are required to supply the following:

- An outline/treatment of the proposed project in no more than 1,000 words. You may also include some audio-visual material.
- A submission outlining the further development of the work
- A CV
- A portfolio of their work (3 copies)

A short list will be drawn up by AFTRS staff and submitted to a panel for consideration. Final selection may be by interview. The panel's selection will be final, and no correspondence will be entered into.

The panel reserves the right to make no award if they deem there are no suitable applications. Applications in a suitably labelled sealed envelope should be placed in the red box in the Student Services foyer (Level 2) by **5pm on Friday, October 14, 2011, or posted to:**
